- (i) the total amount of need-based grant aid and merit-based grant aid from Federal State, and institutional sources, provided to such students; and
- (ii) the total number of students receiving need-based grant aid or merit-based grant aid.

- **COST OF ATTENDANCE:** the average annual cost of tuition and fees, room and board, books, supplies, and transportation for a full-time, first-time, undergraduate student enrolled in the institution.

² **WATCH LIST ITEM:** Institutions whose net price is in the top 5% in their category for the most recent academic year will be placed on a consumer watch list; institutions whose net price is in the top 5% of institutions in their category over a 3-year period (expressed as a percentage change) will be placed on a consumer watch list. These institutions will also be required to submit a report to the Secretary of Education that explains the increases, and a link to this report must be made available to the public. The first watch list is scheduled to be published by July 1, 2011.

³ **INCOME CATEGORIES - IN GENERAL,** for the purposes of reporting the information required, the following income categories shall apply for students who received Federal student financial aid under Title IV:

- (i) \$0-30,000;
- (ii) \$30,001-48,000;
- (iii) \$48,001-75,000;
- (iv) \$75,001-110,000; and
- (v) \$110,001 and more.

***The Secretary may adjust the income categories listed using the Consumer Price Index if the Secretary determines such adjustment is necessary.*
