# **Education Department Guidance – March 5, 2020**

- Initial ED <u>guidance</u> to help colleges navigate COVID-19 crisis.
  - NEW (March 20): Frequently Asked Questions Related to COVID-19
- Broadly covers several major topics, including:
  - Distance Education flexibility
  - Accreditation flexibility
  - Federal Work-Study distributions
  - Enrollment status changes
  - Return of Title IV Funds (R2T4)
  - Withdrawals

# **Accreditation Guidance**

- Accreditors may:
  - <u>Waive</u> Distance Education review requirements for students whose study was interrupted by COVID-19;
  - <u>Extend</u> the term of Accreditation for institutions seeking renewal;
  - Provide good-cause extensions to institutions on a showcause order or probation; and
  - Perform virtual site visits.
- Accreditors have authority to waive clinical requirements, but state licensing requirements may be a hindrance.

## **FERPA Guidance**

- Institutions may disclose student information without consent under the "<u>health and safety</u> <u>emergency</u>" exception if the disclosure is:
  - Necessary to protect the health or safety of students or others;
  - Limited to appropriate parties, e.g., health officials; and
  - Limited to the period of a specific emergency.
- Department will not second guess reasonable determinations.

### **International Students/SEVP Guidance**

- USCIS issued <u>guidance</u> covering 3 scenarios:
  - 1. A school closes and no online or alternate learning options are offered.
  - 2. A school temporarily stops in-person classes but implements online or other alternate learning options and the nonimmigrant student stays in the U.S.
  - 3. Same scenario as #2 above, but the nonimmigrant student departs the U.S.

# **GI Bill Benefits – Veterans Affairs (VA) Guidance**

- VA sent <u>guidance</u> to State Approving Agencies.
- Schools should temporarily suspend enrollment certification if schools have closed or changed educational modality due to COVID-19.
- Schools should contact State Approving Agencies for additional information.
- Congress passed a legislative fix for GI bill benefits (<u>S.</u> <u>3503</u>) that is awaiting the President's signature.
- Working on additional measures

# **Student Mental Health Services Guidance**

- HHS OCR <u>waived</u> penalties for HIPPA violations to allow health care providers to serve patients via "telehealth."
- Mental health service providers are not always considered "health care providers." Varies by state.
- States enacting similar waivers to allow campus-based mental health service providers to treat existing student patients via "tele-health."
- Schools should ask states to waive restrictions.

# **Small Business Administration (SBA) Assistance**

- SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loan Assistance:
  - <u>Includes</u> low-interest federal disaster loans for small businesses suffering substantial economic injury as a result of the coronavirus (COVID-19).
  - NAICU members qualify for the loans (if under \$30 million in maximum revenue).
  - See the <u>online tool</u> to determine whether your institution qualifies as a small business. Use NAICS code 611310 and register now to get in the queue.

## **Census Guidance**

- Census Bureau will <u>count</u> college students where they primarily live and sleep as of April 1, 2020.
  - Students will count as living on campus even if they are home now.
  - Ensures that your community will receive the service support reflected by the population.
- Parents should only include children in college who live with them full-time during the school year.
- Census will collect age, sex and date of birth.
  - Schools can complete form listing all students using data from administrative records.

  - SNAP and school meals
  - Paid sick leave and unemployment
  - Medicaid
- Coronavirus Preparedness and Response Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2020 (H.R. 6074)
  - Funding for federal agency response efforts
- "Supplemental #3" in the works
