


EXECUTIVE SUMMARY





U.S. HIGHER EDUCATION ECOSYSTEM

The ecosystem of America's higher education system is uniquely complex. As part of a diverse array of large public land-grant and regional universities, community colleges and for-profit institutions, the 1,700 private, nonprofit colleges and universities account for nearly 40% of all degree-granting institutions and educate more than 5 million students.





EDUCATING A DIVERSE ARRAY OF STUDENTS


